


Here's how your United Way donation made a difference last year!

Allocated nearly \$2 million to support a vital network of Partner Programs at local health and human service agencies in 4 impact areas and other United Way programs & initiatives.

A collective impact initiative continued to work to increase the number of financially stable homes in the city of Norwich in ten years.

A partnership committed to moving the needle on Healthy Eating, Active Living, and Child Wellbeing through policy and systems change to improve health outcomes for all.



Engaged volunteers all year long at our Food Center, Mobile Pantry, and Partner Programs. Last year we mobilized 2,443 volunteers in all!

Gemma E. Moran United Way/Labor Food Center provided the equivalent of 3.1 million meals at no cost to those in need through a network of local emergency food programs and a Mobile Food Pantry.



Distributed \$40,696 in a round of capacity-building grants to support 9 agencies that are part of the local emergency food system.




With our partners, helped to collect & distribute toys to 1,070 children in need and recruited volunteer groups to assist with distribution.

Due to COVID-19, established the ALICE Relief Fund which provided mobile gift cards to 781 New London County households.

The Gemma E. Moran United Way/Labor Food Center responded by adding new pantries to help get food to those in need, provided the equivalent of 4.1 million meals from March 2020 through August 2021, and mobilized more than 600 volunteers.

Young Leaders United (YLU) are tomorrow's community leaders and philanthropists. This past year, YLU mobilized 25 volunteers and raised \$6,300 towards United Way's work.



SingleCare saved New London County residents a total of \$414,335 on their prescription medications.



United Way 2-1-1 helped 35,836 callers from New London County with service requests for free information and referral. The top 5 request were for: housing and shelter; mental health services; employment/income; healthcare; and utility assistance.
