- Over **42,000** individuals accessed services to improve their own health.
- Reduced barriers and increased access to wrap-around services for **17,600** individuals at Mobile Health Hubs.
- **1,316** seniors maintained their independence through supportive activities and services.
- The Gemma E. Moran United Way/Labor Food Center program served **23,500** people each month through member programs and the Mobile Food Pantry, distributing the equivalent of two million meals.

- **365** individuals prepared for gainful employment through job training and career exploration.

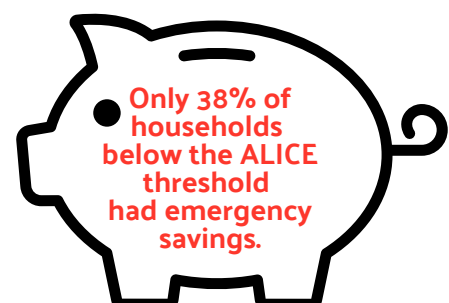
ALICE remains in the crosscurrents

ALICE stands for Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed. In Southeastern Connecticut:

- 60% of Black households
- 63% of Hispanic households
- 78% of female-headed households with children
- 80% of those under 25 years old
